IT'S IN THE ACTION: MEMORIES OF A NONVIOLENT WARRIOR by C. T. Vivian with Steve Fiffer. From finding his religion at the age of five to being arrested as part of the Freedom Riders, C. T. Vivian was a critical member of the Civil Rights Movement, dedicating his life to helping bring peaceful and nonviolent change to our nation. Even after the murder of his friend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Vivian continued to protest, plan and lead organizations dedicated to helping end segregation and racism. Vivian was the driving force behind groups like the Nashville Christian Leadership Conference and the Center for Democratic Renewal (formerly the National Anti-Klan Network), received the Presidential Medal of Freedom, was a featured guest on shows like *Oprah* and *Donahue*, and has been the focus of several documentaries.
